

McKell Wascana Conservation Park is a 171-acre park space in the City of Regina, dedicated to conserving and restoring native prairie and wetland habitat. We have chosen this location to emphasize the importance of a provincial wetland policy by hosting a press conference on World Environment Day, Monday June 5 at 2 pm. We will meet on the bridge.

The goal of the press conference is to bring awareness to the public and give them the opportunity to raise concerns and provide input to the Premier on how this policy will improve water quality. Saskatchewan is the only province in Canada that does not have policy to protect wetlands. In addition, we are launching a letter-writing campaign for the citizens of Saskatchewan to Honorable Scott Moe, Premier of Saskatchewan that urges him to develop a wetland policy first, followed by the agricultural water policy, to ensure that ALL people in the province will benefit from sound water management.

Please join us on June 5, World Environment Day, to show support for wetlands and to take in a guided hike by a knowledgeable member of the Last Mountain Lake Stewardship Group of this incredible wetland.
